

REGIONS IN THE ACA SERVICE STRUCTURE

Adult Children of Alcoholics is membership driven. Local meetings band together to form Intergroups. Intergroups join together to form Regions. Regions representatives join together as the WSO Board to direct the activities of the World Service Organization. Tradition reminders of how ACA works as delineated in our bylaws: 2. Our leaders are but trusted servants, they do not govern; 9. ...we may create service boards or committees *directly responsible to those they serve*.

ACA SERVICE STRUCTURE EVOLVES

In 1977 Tony A. penned the Laundry List characteristics of adult children of alcoholics. In 1981 a central group formed in Southern California that evolved into the ACA World Service Board we have today. Three years later, 1984, ACA became an independent 12-Step program. In the late 1980s and early 1990s Regions formed in Europe #20, Eastern Canada #10, Texas, and California #2. Those Regions disappeared because: too few did too much in service; ACA leaders at the outset had little time in recovery; ACAs are predisposed to let others take the initiative (discounting own abilities); Regions had no steady stream of revenue; and there was no clear mandate of what Regions were to do in the hierarchy. Meetings formed; they merged and formed Intergroups; then World Service sprang from individuals from Intergroups.

REGIONS ARE RISING AGAIN

Currently in place in the ACA service hierarchy is a European Committee, and Western USA Region. In Eastern Canada is a group that performs as a region, we believe, that may soon present their Region representative to WSO. We also have information that there are Intergroups in the Virginia and Washington D.C. area forming a Region.

WHY REGIONS ARE NEEDED NOW

- We need a hierarchy where a lot of people do a little bit
- We have a lot of willing volunteers; we need structure to best communicate
- We need clear bylaws about the service structure
- Representatives of Regions who are the Officers and Chairpersons of WSO committees will best reflect the needs and wants of the groups they serve
- People who represent groups understand how meetings effectively run using bylaws, operations guides, and Roberts' Rules of Order.
- Ballot items passed by delegates to the Annual Business Conference will be given more serious attention by representatives than by unelected volunteers.
- Elected representatives who have worked in ACA service understand that they are limited in what they can do by "the power of the purse" and make decisions based on that basic principle of service.
- Elected representatives understand that all revenues generated from 7th Tradition and Literature are to be used judiciously for program enhancement and not as personal travel and slush funds.
- Region representatives that make up the WSO Board are most likely to place program principles before personalities.
